## MUSIC KNOWLEDGE & SKILLS PROGRESSION - SINGING

Pupils should be taught to:

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- -use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants & rhymes -play tuned and untuned instruments musically
- -listen with concentration and understanding to a range of high-quality live and recorded music
- -experiment with, create, select and combine sounds using the inter-related dimensions of music.

Pupils should be taught to:

- -play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts, using their voices and playing musical instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression
- -improvise and compose music for a range of purposes using the inter-related dimensions of music
- -listen with attention to detail and recall sounds with increasing aural memory
- -use and understand staff and other musical notations
- -appreciate and understand a wide range of high-quality live and recorded music drawn from different traditions and from great composers and musicians
- -Develop an understanding of the history of music.
