Secrets - Secrets are things that people tell you that you can never ever tell

Children should not keep secrets which make them feel worried or uncomfortable

Self-confidence — The belief that you are capable Self-esteem — tow good you feel about yourself

Sexuality - Whether you are attracted to males, females, both or neither

Sharing - The joint use of object or space (taking turns)

Stable - Constant - not changing. Safe.

Stereotype - A group that we put people into without knowing them

Strategies - ways to help yourself cope with things you find difficult Sweat - to give off salty moisture through the pores of the skin

Testicles - Male glands

Trans (short for transgender) - When someone does not feel that they were meant to be the gender they were born into. E.g.: A girl/woman feels that they should have been a boy/man. They may choose to change their appearance and name.

Trust — Feeling safe with someone. Knowing you can believe them. Being honest

Trusted Adult - Grown-ups who you can tell about your worries and they will help you



Unhealthy - Not good for someone's health.
