Wellbeing in Mind Team — Team of NHS staff working with schools to provide advice, support, and training on wellbeing issues, as well as forming a link between school and other services supporting young people. This work includes direct support for young people experiencing mild to moderate mental health, such as anxiety and low mood, support to utilise online resources and develop skills, as well as classroom-based educational sessions in conjunction with the school's pastoral team to improve knowledge and understanding about wellbeing.

Thank you to everyone who has ensured that the children have waterproofs and wellies in school. This is essential kit.










FS2 Bear , Cheetahs & Hippos

Year Two


The children will be focusing on partitioning numbers into different combinations of tens and ones e.g. 54 = 5 tens and 4 ones or 4 tens and 14 ones.





Year 3 Hedgehogs & Impressive Llamas

Next week we are looking at non-ficton texts and learning new facts about woolly mammoths. We will be writing our own information texts too. In Maths we are doing simple addition and subtraction and exploring the alternate vocabulary used.



We have really enjoyed starting to learn French. So far we have learnt how to greet each other and respond. We can ask how a person is and know how to respond. We know how to say what our name is and how to ask another person's name. This week we are exploring numbers to 10. See if you child can remember!
