



News from the Nest

The children in the nest will be reading 'A Squash and a Squeeze' by Julia Donaldson. You can listen to the story here Please send in wellies and lots of spare clothes. As the weather gets better the children will be spending more time playing outside and may get wet.

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Year 1/2 Ewes, Chameleons, Rainbow & Bluebirds

Next week in English we will be focusing on the story 'Mrs Armitage on Wheels'. We will be writing a prediction before reading the story. We will then be writing about Mrs Armitage's wheels using adjectives, verbs and nouns.

In Maths Year 1 will be making equal groups of objects as their introduction to multiplication. They will be adding equal groups together and making equal rows of objects.

Year 2 will be looking at pictograms and reading keys to analyse pictographs they have been given. The children will be identifying the most, least and the difference between the data.

Stage One Cycles will be coming in to work with us on Friday 2nd May. The same routine as this week will be in place for next week e.g. drop off and pick up at the field gate.

Year 3 Hedgehogs & Impressive Llamas

This week the children have been concentrating on the Month of the Military Child. In English we have been creating interesting sentences describing life as a military child. The children were then exploring different strengths and qualities involved in military life. We then made strength cards for our friends and created strength paperchains. Maths has moved onto our new topic of mass, after we completed our end of topic review on length. For geography and computing we have been combining our knowledge and understanding. We will be spending the next few weeks learning lots about Yorkshire. We will then be using our knowledge on coding and computing to create an interesting presentation for our class.

In science, we are starting to explore The Solar System!



























PE will remain the same - outdoor on a Tuesday afternoon and indoor on a Wednesday morning.
