




Magnets can rip holes in your child's gut





Year 1/2 Ewes, Chameleons, Rainbow & Bluebirds

Next week in English we will be reading the story 'Leon and the Place Between'. We will be looking at the pictures in great detail. We will be asking questions to find out more information and making links to other books we have read. We will be writing speech in the form of speech bubbles (year 1) and playscripts (year 2).

In Maths Year 1 will be focusing on time, sequencing events and developing their understanding of seconds, minuets and hours. The children will also be starting to tell the time to the hour and half past the hour.

In Maths in Year 2 the children will be focusing on fractions. They will be identifying, naming and writing fractions for ½, ¼, and ⅓. The children will be solving problems by applying their knowledge of these fractions.

To all the children for participating fully in bike day last Friday. The children joined in all the activities and had a great day. They were determined to succeed and have a great day on their bikes.

The children will finish this topic with a role play shop, where they can sell and buy items from their friends. In geography the children explored Weather vs Climate. This was a good opportunity to compare the climate in UK to other countries we have visited. In PE we are concentrating on Athletics and building up our stamina ready for sports day.
