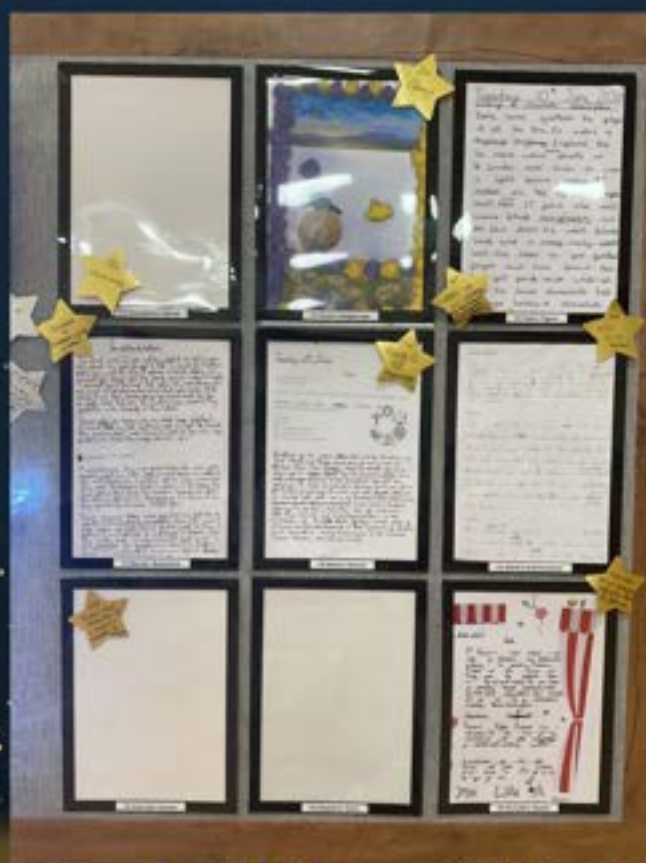



Next week we will continue to use the book 'Leon and the Place Between' for our writing. We will be exploring the sounds, smells and sights of the circus to write a setting description. We will be using adjectives to add more detail. Year 2 will be using emotive language to immerse the reader in their description.

In Maths Year 1 will be moving on to money and looking at British coins and notes and their value.



In Maths Year 2 will be continuing to look at fractions. They will be finding fractions of amounts. The children will be identifying halves, quarters and thirds.
