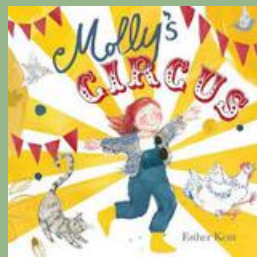

FS1 & 2 Year Olds



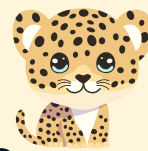
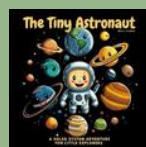

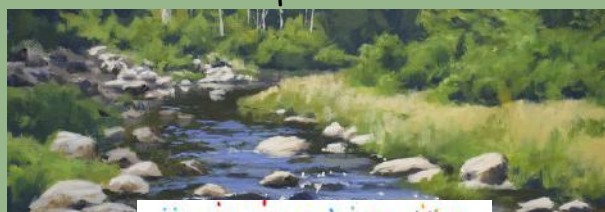
